Brothers At War began in 2013 with a tonne of grapes and a vision to create world class wines with unique expression, using small parcels of exceptional fruit from some of the Barossa's greatest characters. Surrounded by the legacy of Barossa winemaking pioneers, for brothers Angus and Sam Wardlaw, a life in the winemaking industry was inevitable.

What's the worst a little sibling rivalry can bring? A few bruises and a couple of stitches are all part of the joy of brotherhood! The two couldn't have been more different, opposites in every way. Until wine came into their lives..

Starting from humble beginnings and a parcel of Shiraz, they had a bit of fun occupying some spare time on the weekends. Picking up 'Some Other Guys' along the way, including Grape Grower' Chris Alderton, their vision organically grew over the early years. Together, the team of family and friends are continuing to stake their rightful claim in the industry all while keeping a family tradition alive with a wealth of award-winning wines and accolades to be proud of.

Pendee Farm Riesling 2024

The Pendee Farm Vineyard is the backbone of the Brothers at War wines. Planted in the 1960s, this site was selected for its incredible soils, its unique sub climate & for its ability to produce truly unique varietal wines that are truly reflective of the region.

This elegant Eden Valley Riesling showcases lifted floral notes with intense citrus aromatics. The palate of green apple and pear is accompanied by a tight mineral line. This textural Riesling is well balanced with crisp natural acidity. 95 points Wine Orbit, Sam Kim (2023 vintage)



Pendee Farm Cabernet 2023

This varietal Cabernet has a nose of lifted violets, black currants and plums, and a pronounced palate of black cherries and mulberries with star anise. A complex, balanced wine which finishes with silky, lingering

This bright, perfumed Shiraz has lifted violets, black cherry &

Fist Fight Barossa Shiraz 2023 When the brothers were younger, they were known for getting

into a fist fight here and there. Making this blend of Barossa and Eden Valley Shiraz was no exception, made with Sam's love of all things Barossa and Angus' love of all things Eden Valley.

This Barossa Shiraz is deep crimson in colour and displays aromas of forest fruits and wild berries, with additional complex spicy aromas. On the palate are layers of forest fruits, spice and
