



New James Suckling scores for Fabre Montmayou

As we celebrate World Malbec Day, we will be raising a glass to the team at Fabre Montmayou for achieving some great new scores from James Suckling.

Three of these latest results illustrate what a fantastic variety Malbec is, including Fabre Montmayou Grand Vin which is eighty five percent of this mighty grape.



Fabre Montmayou Grand Vin 2022

94 points

This opens up with dark currants, licorice, asphalt and a hint of mint on the nose. Some spices derived from aging. The palate is medium- to full-bodied, sleek and elegant in the context of its creamy and rich style. Bright, with caressing fine-grained tannins. This is made from the oldest vineyard on the property, which was planted in 1908. Already drinking well, but will benefit from a couple of years of cellaring. Drink or hold

Fabre Montmayou Reserva Malbec 2023

92 points

This shows plums, cherries and milk chocolate on the nose, plus some orange peel. On the palate it's youthful, juicy and full-bodied, with fine, lightly crunchy tannins. Drink now or hold.

Fabre Montmayou Gran Reserva Malbec 2023

91 points

This wine opens with aromas of ripe blackberries, savory tapenade and a subtle touch of wet earth. On the palate dark currants take center stage, supported by fine-grained tannins. Medium- to full-bodied. Drink now

New scores were also achieved for two non-Malbec wines; Fabre Montmayou Pinot Noir 2023 and Fabre Montmayou Reserva Cabernet Franc 2023.



Fabre Montmayou Pinot Noir 2023

92 points

"Sliced strawberries, raspberries and brambleberries with a penetrating herbal touch on the nose. The palate is medium-bodied with polished tannins, fresh acidity and a good core of fresh red fruit."



Fabre Montmayou Reserva Cabernet Franc 2023

90 points

"Pine cones, boysenberries and dried flowers on the nose. It's full-bodied but fresh, with salty and savory undertones. Medium tannins."

Wines of Argentina (WofA), the institution responsible for promoting Argentine Wine across the world, is enjoying a month of celebrations centered around Malbec World Day (MWD), the Argentine viticultural sector's most prominent global campaign. This year marks its 15th edition.

Initially created by WofA on April 17, 2011, the objective of Malbec World Day is to reinforce the position of Malbec as Argentina's flagship variety and drive sales in key export markets, which in 2024 were worth USD 429.75 M (FOB) according to provisional data from the National Institute of Viticulture.
